## SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

### Down Bay Regatta, August 10 - 11, 2019

#### 1.0 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017 - 2020 edition, and the rules of the classes of boats competing.

#### 2.0 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the notice board at the North Dock, near the launch cranes.

#### 3.0 CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day they will be in effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.
- 3.2 The Race Committee may, if necessary, will make changes to the Sailing Instructions on the water, and will announce such changes on VHF radio, channel 66 and/or 71. A L flag will also be flown indicating Skippers come within hail.

#### 4.0 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole at the North Dock, near the launching cranes.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 60 minutes" in the race signal AP. This changes RRS Race Signal AP.

#### 5.0 SCHEDULE OF RACES AND SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

Pick up lunches at clubhouse - take with boats racing

1000 Harbor gun

1100 First race warning signal - racing continues - three or four races scheduled, back to back, for each class

1830 Cocktails, dinner, and dancing (not included in registration fee - MUST PURCHASE TICKETS) - casual attire

##### 5.3 Sunday, August 11, 2019

0800-0930 Continental breakfast at Clubhouse

0930 Harbor gun  
1030 First race warning signal - two races scheduled - no starting sequence will begin after 1500  
Lunch and awards on the Clubhouse deck after racing is completed

## 6.0 CLASS FLAGS

6.1 Class flags will be displayed at the Competitors Meeting.

## 7.0 RACING AREA

7.1 Racing will be done on Little Egg Harbor, about 2 1/2 miles north west of the Clubhouse. There will be two race courses used at this regatta. Actual locations of race courses will be discussed at the Skippers Meeting.

## 8.0 COURSES

8.1 The courses will be designated from the back of the signal committee boats. They will indicate the class (A, E, L and B), the magnetic bearing to the windward mark and the number of legs to be sailed. Almost all courses, with the possible exception of the B cats, will be windward leeward.

## 9.0 MARKS

9.1 The mark at the starboard end of the starting and windward finishing line will be a staff flying an orange flag. The staff will be on a race committee boat.

9.2 The E Scows and A Catboats will be using yellow tetrahedron marks with the only exception the A Catboats will be using an orange windward mark. There will be an offset mark at all windward marks unless it is the finish. Lightnings and B Catboats will be using orange tetrahedron marks with the only exception the Lightnings will be a yellow windward mark.

## 10.0 THE START

10.1 The following is added to Rule 26: for the first race of each day, and a race following a long postponement, an orange flag will be displayed with a long sound five minutes before the warning signal.

10.2 The starting line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag on the mark at the starboard end of the line, and the mark at the port end of the line.

10.3 Boats not starting must keep clear of the starting line area during a starting sequence.

10.4 A boat not starting within four minutes of her starting signal will be scored DNS.

## 11.0 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

11.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move a mark, move the gate, or set the finishing line.

11.2 If a mark is moved, the rest of the marks, and the finishing line, may be moved to conform the course to the new wind direction without signal.

## 12.0 THE FINISH

12.1 The windward finishing line is between the staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat at the starboard end of the line, and the mark at the port end of the line. If the committee

boat cannot anchor they will be flying a blue flag and the finish will be between two marks one of which will be the weather mark.

- 12.2 If the finish is to leeward (this will be the preference) for all classes it will be at their leeward gate. For the E Scows, A Catboats, Lightnings and B Catboats the committee boat at the gate is simply taking the finish, and is not a mark of the finishing line - pass between the gate marks to finish. The boat taking the finishes will be flying a blue flag.
- 13.0 PENALTY SYSTEM
- 13.1 Rule 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that one turn, including one tack and one gybe is required.
- 14.0 TIME LIMITS
- 14.1 Boats failing to finish within 20 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored DNF. This changes Rules 35 and A4.
- 15.0 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS
- 15.1 Boats who intend to lodge a protest must notify the committee boat at the finishing line as soon as possible after finishing.
- 15.2 Protest forms are available at the Committee Boat, and shall be delivered there within 45 minutes after the Committee Boat docks at the end of the day's racing.
- 16.0 SCORING
- 16.1 The low point system, with one throw-out if five races are completed. One scored race constitutes the regatta.
- 17.0 COMMUNICATION
- 17.1 The Race Committee will communicate with all competitors and the Race Committee on VHF radio channel 66 for E Scows and A catboats. The Lightnings and B Catboats will use channel 71. Listening to this channel while coming to the race course, starting, and sailing the course is strongly encouraged. All hails of boats on the course at the start, or boats needing to round an end to start, will be made on the VHF radio, and not hearing the call, the order of boat numbers called, not having a VHF radio, or the radio not working properly are not cause for redress.
- 17.2 Communication from competitors to the Race Committee is limited to matters of safety and confusion.
- 18.0 PRIZES
- 18.1 Prizes will be awarded at the Clubhouse Deck, along with lunch, after racing is completed on Sunday.
- 19.0 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY
- 19.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4 in the Racing Rules of Sailing.

## 20.0 TIDES

20.1 The tides will be announced at the skippers meeting Saturday morning. The time is calculated at the coast guard station south of the clubhouse.. If the current is moving the water in opposition to the wind, much care is needed to not be carried onto the course at the start.

## 21.0 CLASSES ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE

21.1 There will be two race courses sailed. The one course will have E Scows and A Cats. The other course will have Lightnings and B Cats (sanderlings) and they will start in the sequence listed above.

Continued starts will be made as directed by the Race Committee.
